Upcoming Commemorations

Patrick, bishop, missionary to Ireland, died 461 - Sunday, March 17, 2024 - A native of Britain, Patrick was kidnapped by pirates at age sixteen and sold into slavery in Ireland. After a few years, he escaped, returned home, and entered the ministry. Returning to Ireland, he successfully served as a bishop and missionary there. Joseph, Guardian of Jesus, Tuesday, March 19, 2024 - Though the Bible tells us little about the husband of Jesus' mother Mary, we know that he was a carpenter or builder by trade. He is also shown as being devoted both to God and to Mary and Jesus. It is assumed that he died before Jesus became an adult. Thomas Cranmer, Bishop of Canterbury, martyr, died 1556, Thursday, March 21, 2024 - Cranmer's lasting achievement is contributing to and overseeing the creation of the Book of Common Prayer, which remains (in revised form) the worship book of the Anglican Communion. He was burned at the stake under Queen Mary for his support of the Protestant Reformation. **Jonathan** Edwards, teacher, missionary to American Indians, died 1758 -Friday, March 22, 2024 - A Puritan minister in Connecticut, Edwards is remembered as being a great preacher. Though his most famous sermon talks at length about hell, he was more concerned with God's love. He served both as missionary to the Housatonic people in Massachusetts, and as president of the future Princeton University.
